## Thank you from St Vincent de Paul at St Colmcille's

This Christmas was a very difficult time for some of our neighbours. Many could not heat their houses, were struggling to keep their electricity going and keeping their Society of St. Vincent de Paul children and themselves fed. The prices of oil, gas and



electricity had gone through the roof, people had found themselves feeding meters and gas and electric were lasting a fraction of the time they used to last. Christmas was a particularly traumatic with the pressure of having to provide gifts for the children. How was all this going to be possible?

You all stepped in and helped create a different story over Christmas for many families. Because of your generosity, we were able to respond to 125 households who had asked for support. Because of your generous donations, we were able to provide vouchers towards gifts for 248 children and young people, provide vouchers for heat and electric for 120 homes and provide fills of oil for 7 homes. You also enabled us to buy Lidl, Iceland and Connswater vouchers which enabled people to do their own Christmas food shopping for 125 households.

Some of the responses from people were very moving. One person wrote to us saying "is this real and not a hoax? I have been worried sick about how I was going to manage Christmas and now this makes it possible". This measure of relief was expressed to us over and over again as people realised that they weren't going to be abandoned or have to take on massive debt to survive Christmas. Your generosity has made this possible, for which, we cannot thank vou enough.

Reflecting on the story of the good Samaritan, when the Lawyer is quizzing Jesus, he asks, "who is my neighbour?". Most, if not all these people you will never know, but you have been the neighbour who helped people who were desperate this Christmas and indeed many of you continue to do it all year round.

Because of your kindness and generosity, we were able to spend just shy of £20,000 to help people over Christmas.

On behalf of the St Colmcille's Conference of St Vincent de Paul, Thank you very much. You have made a real difference for people this Christmas.
