LAUDATO SI' GROUP

Laudato Si' Week, May 21st - 28th is an opportunity to celebrate the beauty, diversity, and interconnectedness of all of creation as well as the care of creation initiatives that offer hope for the future of our Common Home. We are grateful for the following four initiatives, In their new book The Parish as Oasis: An Introduction to Practical Environmental Care (Messenger Publications, Dublin, 2022) Kevin Hardagen and Ciara Murphy, from the Jesuit Centre for Faith and Justice, make the point that care for creation and social justice are deeply interconnected. And that communal action for change is much more effective than individual action. They advocate that the parish is the ideal place to start. 'A parish really pushing together in the work of protecting their common home? That would have an impact nationally'(p.23). How can we as a parish community work together to protect our common home? One possibility is signposted by the recent call of the Irish Bishops to use a percentage of parish grounds as a haven for pollinators and biodiversity in order that it can be enjoyed in perpetuity by the whole

community'.
