LAUDATO SI' GROUP

This week marks the eighth anniversary of the publication of Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si' on care for our common home*, in which we are all called to make a profound interior conversion, a change of heart. This conversion entails gratitude for God's loving gift of creation and 'a loving awareness that we are not disconnected from the rest of creatures but joined in a splendid universal communion' (LS para 220). What is needed is not just individual but community conversion. 'Social problems must be addressed by community networks and not simply by the sum of individual good deeds.' (LS para 219). Pope Francis writes that communities can be transformed by a shared action to protect the local environment. 'Around these community actions, relationships develop and a new social fabric emerges. Thus, a community can break out of the indifference induced by consumerism' (LS 232). What are the ways in which we as a parish community can achieve this?

This weekend we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came down upon the apostles. In an instant a group of frightened disciples were empowered to go out and proclaim God's amazing dream for the world - the Good News of Jesus Christ!

When we read about Pentecost and the birth of the Church in the Acts of the Apostles, we find inspiration for where we are as a Church here in Ireland today. We know that we have come to a fork in the road. We can't keep going the way we were, we have to head out on a new pathway.
