## PARISH ENGAGEMENT GROUP

Dee McCabe, Parish Engagement Group Coordinator, explained last Sunday at the commissioning, the origin and role of this parish group -

"In September last year we were all invited, as a parish, to an Emmaus Day, which was facilitated by Maria Garvey. We reflected on what is going well, and where we would like to grow and develop our parish. That day was the seed amongst people who expressed interest in continuing the discussion, and they came together and formed the Parish Engagement Group.

Each parish must have a Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Engagement Group will meet that requirement. We have rebranded it, to better reflect the needs of the modern-day parish and more specifically this parish, to align it with our mission.

Pope Francis has encouraged moving away from pastoral rigidity and highlighted 3 aspects which he felt were most important, and marked the journey of a parish. These 3 aspects are: listening to God's word, walking, and proclaiming even to the outskirts.....all a shared vison of our Parish Engagement Group. Our monthly meetings commence with the lighting of our candle, prayer, and space to listen to God's word. When Pope Francis refers to walking, he is referring to working together to a point of familiarity where we don't just know each other's names we know each other's pets names too. His third aspect is about inclusiveness, and I will explain now how these two aspects are also part of our mission.

A key purpose is to build love and a sense of community in our parish. Our mission will include supporting opportunities in the parish to have a living faith; inclusion – identifying those in the community that need support but also that the warmth of our parish is experienced as an invite to all in the community, regardless of their faith, that they may join us in the events run in St Colmcille's. We are also concerned with developing our youth ministry and linking in with families.

You may notice the main difference in the title is a move towards the word 'Engagement'. Alone we will likely achieve little. However, if we see this word "engagement" as an invite that enables collaborative working, where we work alongside all our parishioners and tap into the gifts, talents, knowledge, and expertise of this parish, encouraging involvement and participation, then there is genuine potential to do a lot. I think this fits in nicely with Pope Francis' vison of walking together.

There is so much wonderful work being carried out in our parish already by individuals and groups. It is not our mission to duplicate, but to bolster what's working well, support what needs supporting, and identify gaps relevant to our mission. With that in mind we will be inviting all those individuals and groups already active in the parish to an event on the morning of **Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> April**. There will be more details to come, but please save the date for now."
